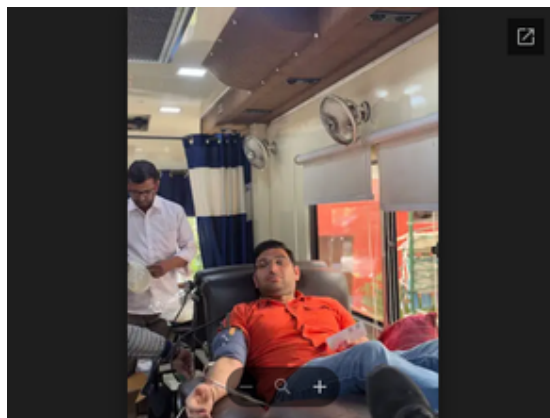

Annual Blood Donation Camp – A Tradition of Service

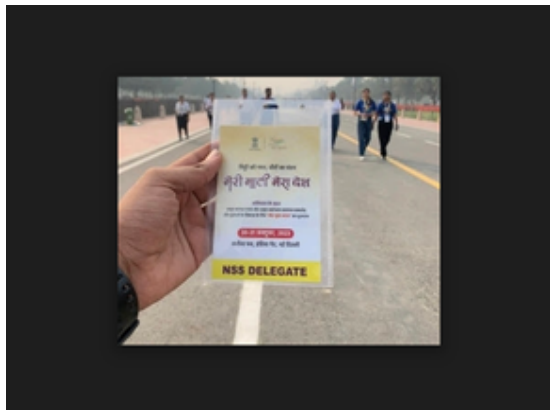
